RE: Resolution 09022016-2 in Response to Action Request #1617002

On September 9, 2016, the Faculty Senate officially passed the following motion to request guidance from Chancellor on the campus vision for Distance Education at Kapi'olani Community College.

Resolution:

Based on a recommendation from the Distance Education Committee, the Faculty Senate requests, in light of recent changes to ACCJC standards relating to online learning, that the Administration give a clear and precise statement of the Chancellor's vision for Distance Education at KCC:

- Exactly what percentage of classes is expected to be fully online, and by what date?
- Do these metrics apply to the number of courses, or the number of individual classes? E.g. if 20 out of 50 sections of ENG 100 are online, is this counted as 1 course out of the total number of courses that are online, or 20 out of the total number of classes that are online?
- What exactly is the target success rate in online courses, how was that number determined, and what is the current baseline?
- How does that target relate to the target success rate for face-to-face courses?

The Distance Education Committee requests that the information be shared via CAC or VCAC and in writing to Faculty Senate.
